



Confederated Tribes of the Goshute Reservation 2021 Big & Small Game Hunting and Fishing Proclamation

Pursuant to its Constitution, the Confederated Tribes of the Goshute Reservation (CTGR) Business Council is responsible to protect the health, safety, and welfare of its Tribal Members. This includes the management and protection of all wildlife. Pursuant to its responsibilities, the Business Council will be exclusively responsible for the 2021 Big & Small Game Hunting and Fishing Proclamation. The Business Council announces the Draw for all Permits/Tags for the 2021 hunting season as follows:

DRAW

Place: CTGR Tribal Administration Building, Ibapah, Utah

Date: Friday, July 16, 2021

Time: 12:00 PM (Noon)

PERMIT DESCRIPTIONS

Mule Deer Buck – 5 Total Tags – \$10 Non-Refundable Application Fee plus \$40 Permit/Tag fee if you Draw

Bull Elk – 5 Total Tags – \$10 Non-Refundable Application Fee plus \$40 Permit/Tag fee if you Draw

Turkey – 5 Total Tags – \$5 Non-Refundable Application Fee plus \$20 Permit/Tag fee if you Draw

ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS

Membership: Must be an enrolled member of CTGR

Age: Must be 12 years of age or older

Registration: All Non-Refundable Application Fees must be submitted to Business Council Secretary Phyllis Naranjo by 11:30 AM on Friday, July 16, 2021.

Present: Do not have to be present to be awarded a Permit/Tag in the Draw.

Exemption: Tribal Elders are exempt ONLY from all Non-Refundable Application fees. All other rules apply.

Waiting Period: ALL CTGR Tribal members are eligible. No past waiting periods will be enforced. If selected for this year, there will be no future waiting period.

Payment: Money orders, cashiers checks, and certified checks ONLY. NO personal checks. No cash accepted. All purchases are final. No refunds.

HUNTING AND FISHING REGULATIONS

CTGR Tribal Member: Any person whose name appears on the enrollment records of CTGR.

CTGR Tribal Member Elder. A Tribal Member Elder is any enrolled member of the Confederated Tribes of the Goshute Reservation who is 55 years of age or older.

Non-Tribal Member: Individuals who are not enrolled CTGR Tribal Members are classified as non-tribal members. These individuals are subject to non-member Permit/Tag fees and hunting periods that may differ from CTGR Tribal Member hunts.

CTGR Tribal Members Spouse: Any person who is legally married to a CTGR Tribal Member. CTGR does not recognize common law marriage for hunting purposes. To prove marriage, a valid marriage certificate must be submitted with the application.

Permits: All individuals who are hunting must be in possession of valid Permit, also referred to as "Tags", at all times. Permits must be completely filled out at the time wildlife game is taken.

Age Eligibility Requirement. CTGR Tribal Members must be at least 12 years old to obtain a Permit/Tag for hunting and must be accompanied by any adult (18 years of age or older) for all hunting activities.

CTGR Tribal Identification. CTGR Tribal Members are encouraged to carry their tribally issued identification cards on their person while engaged in hunting and fishing.

CTGR Tribal Elder Proxy Hunting. A Tribal Member Elder may allow another eligible Tribal Member to hunt for them in any hunt. The Tribal Member Elder must submit a request to the CTGR Business Council that another Tribal Member be allowed to hunt on their behalf. The request must specifically designate the name of the hunter. The CTGR Business Council and the designated hunter must be given a copy of the request. The CTGR Business Council must approve, in writing, the request prior to the hunt.

Non-Tribal Member Accompaniment: CTGR Tribal Members may have 1 non-member accompany him/her to assist with the harvest. However, if any non-member is caught in the possession of a firearm, the CTGR Tribal Member will be subject to loss of hunting privileges.

Harvest Reporting: For game tracking and management purposes, all hunters must report harvest information to any CTGR Business Council Member or Law Enforcement Officer. If reported to Law Enforcement, such information must be immediately reported to the CTGR Business Council. All hunters must comply with CTGR Business Council procedures to ensure accountability.

Bull Elk Teeth Requirements: In order to track the ages of the bull elk, all hunters who take bull elks pursuant to this proclamation are **required** to turn in to any CTGR Business Council Member, or to the Business Council Secretary, the bottom two front teeth (incisors). If these teeth are not turned in, the hunter shall not be eligible for permits for the following two (2) years.

Prohibition on Sale of Permit/Tags: All Permit/Tags must be used by the Tribal Member initially assigned the tag, either by draw or by purchase. Any sale of a Permit/Tag is strictly prohibited.

Waste: All game taken pursuant to this proclamation must be used for subsistence purposes. Any waste of game is strictly prohibited.

Hunting Violations: Hunting outside of specified hunting dates and harvesting a game animal that you do not have a Permit/Tag for is **not** permitted. Any person who hunts outside specific dates or without a Permit/Tag may be subject to civil and/or criminal prosecution.

Prosecution: Any violation of the Proclamation, Ordinance 88-ORD-01, or the Civil Trespass Ordinance is considered an offense against CTGR laws which may be punishable by any appropriate civil or criminal penalties, including revocation of fishing and hunting permits, confiscation and forfeiture of equipment, and any other authorized penalties.

Hunter Education Course Card. Any persons born after December 31, 1965 are encouraged to have a valid Hunter Education Course Card. For more information on obtaining a Hunter Education Card, please check with Utah or Nevada Wildlife Department on upcoming classes. (In 2021, all hunters 12 years of age to 18 years of age will be required to possess a Hunter Education Course Card.)

Off Highway Vehicles (OHV): All terrain vehicles (ATV), side by sides, snowmobiles and any other similar off highway vehicles can be used for the retrieval of game only and are restricted to use on the main reservation and mountain roads only.

Camping Regulations: Any Tribal Member, and their families, may camp anywhere on the CTGR Reservation at no cost. Non-member camping is restricted to the RV rental spaces and is subject to per-day rental fees. All hunters may camp anywhere without fee, subject to the civil trespass ordinance and other laws surrounding access to the CTGR Reservation.

Littering: Please remember to respect CTGR Tribal lands. Clean up your litter.

Campfires: Campfires are allowed during camping activities. Do not leave an open campfire unattended. Extinguish all campfires thoroughly before vacating your camping area.

Drugs and Alcohol Prohibition: During any hunt, there shall be **NO DRUGS OR ALCOHOL ALLOWED**. It is **UNLAWFUL** for any person to handle or discharge a firearm while under the influence of drugs or alcohol.

Have a very safe and productive hunting season!

**** FOR YOUR INFORMATION, BUCKS & BULLS WILL BE CONDUCTING THE FOLLOWING HUNTS. PLEASE RESPECT THEIR HUNTING DATES – July 25, 2021 – November 24, 2021. WHEN HUNTING OR OTHERWISE IN THE AREA, PLEASE DO NOT INTERFERE IN ANY WAY WITH THE BUCKS & BULLS HUNTS, AS THIS IS A MAJOR SOURCE OF ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT FOR CTGR. THESE DATES FOR BUCKS & BULLS AND THE HUNTS FOR TRIBAL MEMBERS OVERLAP THIS YEAR TO PROVIDE TRIBAL MEMBERS WITH THE MAXIMUM TO HUNT, AS WAS NOT THE CASE IN THE PAST. THE CTGR BUSINESS COUNCIL REMINDS ALL TRIBAL MEMBERS THAT TO MAXIMIZE THE TRIBAL HUNT TIMES, THIS NOTICE SHOULD BE STRICTLY COMPLIED WITH.**
